GENERAL RULES PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

GENERAL

1. Entry for the Show, except those classes which are open, is confined to persons in the Club area. The club area covers the parishes of Laggan, Kingussie, Alvie, Rothiemurcus, Duthill, Abernethy, Cromdale, Inverallan, Kirkmichael, Knockando, Inveravon, Aberlour and Mortlach.
2. No Member can enter or exhibit stock or other items until all arrears and the current year's subscription have been paid. Admission to the Showfield will be by Member's Badge issued on receipt of subscription.
3. All disputes shall be referred to the Special Disputes Committee whose decision shall be final. Whenever possible, the committee shall consider and give their decision on Show day. Notification regarding disputes must be made by written notices as follows:-

By Attending Members immediately following completion of judging of relevant class.

By Exhibitors before 4 pm on day of Show.

In every case the sum of £10 must be lodged along with a letter outlining cause of dispute. In the event of the complaint being upheld by the Committee the £10 deposit will be returned.
4. The Judge shall in all cases distribute prize awards in accordance with the number of entries of each class; ie he shall judge the exhibits on their merits and shall not be empowered to withhold any section, class or special prize awards.
5. Prize Money
Please note that all prize money will be paid by Bank Transfer and the Payment form must be filled in and returned with your bank entries. If no bank details are forwarded then we will assume that you have donated your winnings to the Society.

Only prize money for the Young Handlers sections and Young Farmers Calf Competition will be paid on the day of the show.
6. Intending exhibitors must enter on the prescribed form of entry not later than 5 July 2024. All stock must be stalled and exhibits in place not later than 8.30am and judging will commence at 9:00 am prompt. Horse Judging will start at 8.30am. Judging of Clydesdale horses will commence at 11:00 am. No stock are to be removed from the Showfield or from the stalls, pens or paddocks allocated to them before 4:00 pm (Horses 3.00pm)
7. All Exhibitors and competitors should contact the attending member of the appropriate section at the Showfield.
8. Any Exhibitors infringing any of the foregoing rules may be required to forfeit all prizes won by them at the Show and may be debarred from showing for a period of three years.
9. In Livestock classes, except where otherwise stated, where there are seven or eight entries, prize money of equivalent value to the third prize in the appropriate class will be given to the fourth prize winner as well as the usual prize ticket. Where there are nine or more entries, prize money of equivalent value to the third prize will be given to the fifth prize winner.
10. All stock must be the property of the Exhibitors and must have been in his or her possession since 1 June 2024.

LIVESTOCK

- 11 Exhibitors must be prepared to give the names of the breeders of prize-winning stock, with certificates of age if required.
- 12 No animal can compete in more than one class, except in those for Group of Sheep, consisting of Tup, Ewe, Gimmer and Lamb, and Group of Three Cattle, and certain Horse and Pened Cattle Classes.
- 13 Entry Fees (Per entry)

- 14 Cows and Heifers entered in those classes for animals in milk must be in milk and persons in charge must be prepared to prove that this is the case if requested by the Judge.
- 15 Any animal whose attendant is not in charge during judging will not be allowed to be exhibited. Prize money may also be forfeited if prize winning animals are not forward for the Grand Parade. This applies equally to the Grand Parade of Horses.
- 16 Stock attendants will be asked by loudspeaker, 15 minutes prior to the Grand Parade, to stand by their animals in readiness for the Parade. The Parade will enter the ring in good order and at the proper time under the direction of the Livestock Convenor.
- 17 There shall be no "prizing out" of any stock of any kind with regard to the 2024 Summer Show.
- 18 No animal will be allowed to enter the Show yard out of any Herd, Flock or Stud where any contagious or infectious disease exists or has existed within a period of four months previous to the Show. If it is discovered that an animal within the Show yard has contracted any contagious or infectious disease then that animal, together with all other animals belonging to the same Exhibitor, will be expelled from the Showfield. All Blue Tongue vaccinations must be up to date. The veterinary surgeon's decision will be final. The committee recommends that all equines attending the Show should have a current Equine Flu vaccination but this is not compulsory.
- 19 All 1st, 2nd and 3rd prize winners should be made available for the Grand Parade or prize money may be forfeited.

NORTH SHOWS CIRCUIT YOUNG FARMERS' CALF COMPETITION
Competition Rules

1. The competition is open to members of the SYFA aged 14 and over, and under 30.
2. Participating shows are: Black Isle, Caithness, Grantown, Latheron, Nairn and Sutherland.
3. The entrant to show a calf born on or after 1st March of year prior to show.
4. One entry per person, per class. There is no limit to the number of classes a person may enter.
5. There will be 2 Pedigree classes and 2 Commercial classes at each show – calf born between 1st March and 1st September AND calf born between 2nd September and show day.
6. In each class, entrants will be judged on ringcraft, stockmanship as well as the quality of the animal. Up to five points will be awarded based on each of the separate elements.
7. If there is a large entry, the class will be split into stot and heifer sections.
8. Ear tags must be entered prior to show day.
9. The Overall Young Farmers' Calf Champion and Reserve at each show will be judged between the Pedigree YF champion and the Commercial YF champion and reserves. In the event of a tie the Overall Cattle Judge will make the final decision.
10. At each show the points will be recorded and sent to Grantown Show where overall winner will be announced, and the trophy presented.
11. Engraving of the trophy and its return to Grantown Show the following year shall be the responsibility of the recipient.
12. A Commercial Calf **CANNOT** be shown in another class in the Commercial Section **BUT CAN** compete for the Commercial Champion.
13. A Pedigree calf may be shown in another Pedigree class and can compete for Pedigree Champion.
14. Prize money at each participating show:
Champion - £50, Reserve - £30 (provided by each show)
15. Prize money annually to awarded at Grantown Show:
Champion - £100, Reserve - £25.

ROSETTES

All prize winning Cattle and Horses will wear Rosettes in the Grand Parade. Prize Rosettes will be worn on the "crowd" side arm of the Stock Attendant. Colours are as follows: -

HORSES AND PONIES SECTION

Horses to be in Showground by 8 am
Judging will commence at 8.30am prompt

Rules

- The organisers & landowners do not accept any liability for accident or damage, injury or illness to horses, riders, ground spectators or any other persons or property.
- Competition is run under BRC rules inc Current 2023 Hat regulations.
- Riders should be of an appropriate size and weight for the horse/pony being ridden anywhere on the showground, exercise areas or vehicle parks. Equine regulations state that the rider and tack weight should not exceed 20% of the animal's bodyweight'. If this is found to be exceeded the combination will not be allowed to compete.
- The organisers hold the right to amalgamate, alter or cancel any of the classes.
- Verification of horse/pony age and height must be available upon request. If not available horse/pony will not be allowed to compete. These will be randomly checked.
- Stallion disk must be worn, at all times.
- Handler of any stallion or Colt must be 14 years old or over.
- Handlers of ponies in In Hand classes aged 14 years and under must wear a correctly secured skull cap/riding hat that meet current regulations.
- Whips/canes must not exceed an overall length of 76cms (30 inches)
- No ill treatment of horses or ponies at any time, whether by misuse or excessive use of whip, bit, item of saddlery or in any other way what so ever.
- A fall of horse/pony or rider in any class will result in disqualification. The rider must not remount in the ring.
- The rider/handler may not remove their pony or themselves from the ring during judging, without the judge's permission. The class ends when the judge dismisses the class.
- No unauthorised persons to enter arenas.
- Riders, handlers and their grooms must, at all times present themselves in the show ring neatly and smartly dressed.
- Riders, handlers and their grooms must have a hat on when entering the ring.
- The decision of the Judge is FINAL in every case.
- The class is closed to competitors once the ring gate is shut. Unless judge allows them to enter.
- Competitor's may enter as many classes as they wish/want, however if the classes clash competitor must pick which class takes preference.
